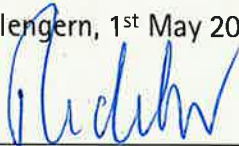
and that our suppliers operate under the following principles.

- **Conflict Minerals**

H.R. 4173 "Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act" Section 1502 "Conflict Minerals" – Suppliers are obliged to ensure that their products do not contain any "conflict minerals" such as tin, tungsten, tantalum or gold from the Congo or neighbouring countries.

REGULATION (EU) 2017/821 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 17 May 2017 laying down supply chain due diligence obligations for Union importers of tin, tantalum and tungsten, their ores, and gold originating from conflict-affected and high-risk areas – Hettich is not considered a Union importer in this context but obliges its suppliers to comply with appropriate due diligence requirements.
